Meals

Students will eat three meals a day in the residence hall cafeterias. Our first meal will begin with Monday dinner and conclude with Sunday breakfast. Please bring money for lunch Monday (a sack lunch will also work). We will stop for lunch on our way to Lincoln before registering at the Festival.

Money

Little to no money is needed at Festival, some students do bring a small amount of money to purchase snacks from vending machines or souvenirs such as t-shirts or scripts being sold by vendors in the Lied Center.

Miscellaneous

Programs. Each student will receive a printed program in his or her registration packet at the Festival. The week's timetable, workshop descriptions, and performance schedule is listed here. Additional copies are sold at the Thespian desk in the lower lobby of the Lied Center.

Badges. Each student will receive an identification badge that must be worn for admission to all Festival activities.

Exhibits. Commercial, college, and university exhibits will be displayed in the upper two lobbies of the Lied Center. Vendors will be selling theatre-related items.

Auction. On Friday night the International Thespian Officers will host a Theatre Themed auction.

Security information

Campus police will be on duty at all times.

Alcohol/drugs/weapons/tobacco. Students who consume drugs or alcohol or who are under the influence of drugs or alcohol during Festival week will be returned home. UNL is a smoke-free campus; smoking is not permitted in any campus building. Students bringing weapons of any type onto campus will be sent home immediately.

Curfew. Students must be in their assigned dormitories by 12:00 a.m. and in their assigned dorm rooms by 12:30 a.m. Quiet hours—with lights out—begin at 1:00 a.m. Dorm doors will be locked at 10:00 p.m. to insure students' safety. UNL guards will be on duty from 10:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. to allow students to enter the dorms. A 24-hour desk clerk will be on duty in each dorm; students entering dorms late must be cleared by the clerk. Students arriving after the curfew will not be able to enter the dorms until they report to security personnel and notify Mr. Shafer. Students missing curfew will meet with Mr. Shafer and security personnel the next day at 8:00 a.m.

Residence halls. Students & chaperones will not be permitted on dorm floors housing students of the opposite sex.

Emergencies. Emergency incoming telephone calls must be channeled through the 24-hour desk at (402) 472-1010. Reference must be made to the student's attendance at Thespian Festival.

Health center. Students requiring emergency medical attention during the day will be directed to UNL's health center. Hours are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. After-hours medical emergencies will be taken to the Bryan LGH West Hospital, 2300 South 16th Street, (402) 475-1011. Students are to report illness to Mr. Shafer.

Festival attendance. All students are required to attend the events scheduled during Festival week. Students are not permitted—under any circumstances—to leave the UNL campus.

Property damage. Students are not allowed to remove UNL property from residence hall rooms and are to keep their rooms locked. Students are not permitted to post messages on dorm windows. Students will be responsible to UNL for damage to their room or to university property. The Festival will bill the student, the parents, and/or the school for damage fees not collected at check-out. For safety reasons, students may not remove screens from

dorm rooms or lounge windows. Students removing screens will be fined \$50 and will be required to replace the screens immediately. Students repeating the offense will be sent home. Prior to check-out, students are asked to clean their rooms and the hall lounges to the condition in which they were found at check-in.

University regulations. Beverages and food are not permitted at any time in the auditorium, classrooms, or lobbies of the Lied Center or the UNL theatres. The burning of incense is prohibited in residence hall lounges and sleeping rooms. Students are not allowed to have fireworks on campus. Students are not permitted to play "boom boxes" (radios, cassettes, CD's, etc.) in their rooms after 1:00 a.m. Students are not permitted to use chalk on the UNL sidewalks. During performances, use of cameras and recording devices are prohibited in the Lied Center and UNL theatres. Students are guests of the University and should conduct themselves graciously. Respect for other students, UNL staff and students, and local citizens is expected of all Festival participants. Excessive noise and improper language will not be tolerated. Students should walk on sidewalks (not in the streets) and avoid campus parking structures. Skateboards and in-line skates are not permitted on campus. The University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Thespian Festival, LLC are not responsible for loss or breakage of personal effects, money, or valuables.

Violations. Students violating Festival security rules and regulations will meet with Mr. Shafer and security personnel at the 8:00 a.m. security meeting in the Abel Hall snack bar. If a student is sent home from the Festival for any reason, the parents, guardians, or next of kin will be financially responsible for all costs incurred in returning the student home.
